

Our Recognition Assemblies are just one more opportunity for us as a school to recognize and support the quality work accomplished by our students. The various honor rolls recognized give our students a goal to which they may strive.



The following honors will be given at the Recognition Assembly:

Principal's Honor Roll – Awarded at the end of the quarter for students who achieve an "A" in every academic area.

Blizzard's Honor Roll – Awarded at the end of the quarter for students who achieve an "A" or "B" in every academic area.

Principal's Challenge – Awarded at the end of the second, third, and fourth quarters for students who improve in at least two academic areas and do not go down in any of the other academic areas.

Citizenship Honors – Awarded at the end of each quarter for students who achieve recognition in the following areas:

- Assumes Responsibility

Math Corner

Answers to School Improvement News, Math Corner January 2005

- a. Answers will vary. One Possible response is shown.



- b. The sum of beats in all the notes must be 4. 4 quarter notes are equal to 1. 2 quarter notes are equal to one-half. Two half notes are equal to a whole. I have one half note and two quarters that equal one measure, two half notes that equal one measure, one whole, and 4 quarter notes that equal one measure.

- c. $(\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4}) + (\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2}) + 1(\frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{4}) = 1 + 1 + 1 + 1 = 4$
